Recycle Questions

When it says "recycle" and is not highlighted are those just cardboard containers?

I believe all recycle is just carboard, with paper included in it......except for the two smaller carts at Mar Lee, which recycle plastic, tin, glass, etc.

There are some recycle dumpsters that are a co-mix of recycle items.

I will re-do the worksheet for Lakeview to update that information.

I have also found a couple of other changes in the requests.

The items that I have highlighted shows anything that is NOT a "weekly" pick-up. Since the majority of the lines are weekly pick-ups, I wanted to bring to your attention the ones that weren't weekly.

Open Top Questions:
